Bimblebox at the IUCN World Parks Congress

We will be in Sydney next week to remind Minister Greg Hunt that, by approving a mine on Bimblebox Nature Refuge, Australia is not meeting its obligations under the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD).

As it will bring together around 3,000 people from more than 160 countries, we saw this <u>conference</u> as a one-off opportunity to create awareness within the international community and to tell the real story of what happens to 'protected areas' in Australia.

The International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) World Parks Congress meets every ten years, and it so happens this year Sydney will be the host, from 12-19 November. Australia has been a signatory since 1992, but its legislation fails to protect biodiversity in IUCN category VI protected areas that make up the National Reserve System.

Our first communication with the IUCN was in 2009, when we sent a <u>letter</u> to the Secretariat of the CBD urging them to contact the relevant ministers in regard to the conflict between protected areas and destructive mining activities in light of Australia's responsibilities as a signatory of the CBD.

Thanks to <u>Protect The Bush Alliance</u> (PTBA),funds were available for Paola to attend the Congress and share a booth with the PTBA. We are also grateful to Tangible Media's Greg and Emma Harm for their technical help. Writer Sharyn Munro, BirdLife Australia's Sheena Gillman, Mackay Conservation Group's Patricia Julien, and members of the Places You Love Alliance will also be there supporting the campaign against mining in protected areas.
